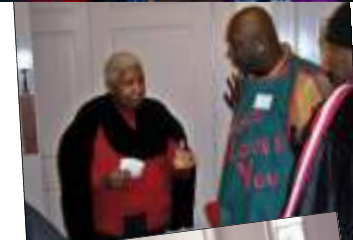

The block below, gives the count as to how many families were served and how many children were blessed by everyone's generosity.

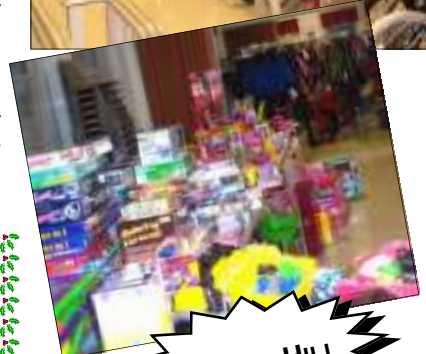

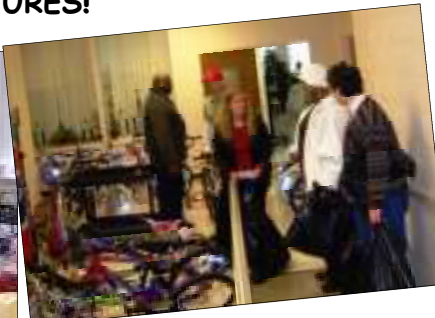
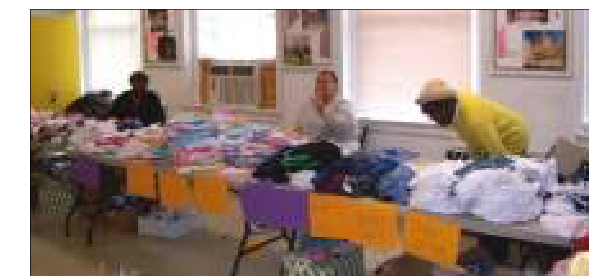

**FROM YOUR DOM, PETE DU PLESSIS**

Greetings!

This will make such a big difference as we plan for Spring activities and the Summer camping season. Again, let me say thank you for so freely giving to the dining hall expansion project and now to the water supply solution. I believe that this year's Summer Camp will be one of our very best. I get all excited just thinking about how wonderful it is going to be for all of our inner-city children coming to the mountains for a wilderness camping experience with God.

A hard-working crew from Broadus Memorial Baptist Church came in November 2006 to clean up the grounds around the RBA office building. The "Broadus Bunch" did a fantastic job in making a real difference in the "curb-side appeal" of our grounds. But alas, another such work day is necessary to finish the needed work around the building and on the grounds. Elaine and I and all the RBA staff pray that you and yours will have a Happy New Year all year long! Thank you for the many cards and calls expressing Christmas best wishes to me and the RBA staff. We did so enjoy the Christmas season of 2007. Needless to say, we are very grateful for your every expression of care and concern for us.

**EVANGELISM THRUST IN SOUTH AFRICA**

It appears that Virginia Baptists have made a commitment to provide support for about twelve church planters in the Free State Baptist Association of the Baptist Union of South Africa. The Richmond Baptist Association is sponsoring four of those twelve indigenous church planters in the Free State Association.

The Baptist Union of South Africa is in the midst of an extensive evangelism campaign known as "Impact 2010." Each year the Baptist Union puts focus on one or two different provinces (states) within the country. In 2008 the focus will be on the Free State province. The leadership of the Free State Association has asked Virginia Baptists to send 30 evangelism teams to blanket the province with various outreach projects. Many of these teams will engage in visitation and outreach projects during the day, inviting people to nightly tent meetings. Ideally, a small outreach team would have three or more volunteers: someone to preach, someone to lead a local team in children's ministry, and someone to lead a local team in youth outreach. There will also be some requests for teams to do outreach projects which do not involve traditional visitation, things such as sports camps and backyard Bible clubs.

Teams will be sent during the first two weeks of August, September, and October of 2008. The cost of the trip for each person will be around \$2,500.00. and referrals. At any time, anyone can find them-  
selves needing answers to problems they never before  
encountered, whether for themselves or for others. All  
calls are confidential. Centers are open from 8:15  
a.m. to 12:00 midnight, seven days a week, and it is as  
simple as dialing 2-1-1. This new phone number, 2-1-  
1, is a good resource for churches that receive people  
by phone call or on their doorsteps, needing money,  
food, and other kinds of help. By calling 2-1-1 you can  
get connected and get answers.
