Greetings!  
As you read the newspaper headlines or listen to the news broadcast, you may get the feeling that the world is in a state of turmoil. But even in the midst of what appears to be chaos and confusion, God is continuously at work bringing people to Himself. The newsletters of our various RBA churches tell so many wonderful stories of God's provision for mission and ministry. How good it is to read about Vacation Bible Schools, Youth retreats, mission trips, benevolent ministries and special summer activities that have blessed the lives of untold people. God is indeed at work all around us and we must be careful to hear his invitation to join Him in what He is doing! As we yield to the leadership of the Holy Spirit, God can use us to be ministers of reconciliation to a lost and dying world.

There will be a number of recommendations from various groups for our consideration. I would like to see messengers from every RBA church present for this important annual meeting of the association.

God has been so very gracious to us in blessing the ministry of Camp Alkulana this year. Building the addition to the dining hall was quite a challenge, but the work was completed in time for the expanded space to be used by our summer campers. And what a big difference it made at meal time as the boys and girls had plenty of room to enjoy their meals together. The RBA Executive Council in its August meeting approved the employment of a part-time Site Director for Camp Alkulana. Missy Landrum and her husband, Jimmy, live near the Camp in Bath County and will be available to care for the physical needs of the Camp on short notice. Missy will enhance the ministry of our year-round retreat facilities provided to churches and groups looking for a retreat location throughout the year.

And we must praise the Lord for His manifold blessings as many of our RBA churches reached and exceeded their offering goals for the Camp Alkulana Offering. The goal of \$90,000.00 provides the necessary funds called for in the RBA budget to operate Camp Alkulana for a year. At the end of August, the Camp has received \$98,168.06 for the ministries it provides. Hallelujah! The money given in excess of the goal amount will be placed in a Camp Emergency Reserve Fund. This summer, the Camp had some difficulties with the water system. A team is working now to quickly resolve that well water problem so the Camp will be ready for use at any time. God is good to give us the resources needed to carry on this vital ministry of changing lives for the glory of God. We thank all of our churches for your faithful and generous giving to Associational work.

**LAMP REPORT**  
*“Latin American Mission Project”*

Greetings,

I am very happy to report that the attendance at La Primera is growing. When we arrived in 2003 the church had about 45 attendees. In the four years of this ministry to Latinos we opened three other missions, Los Pescadores in Mechanicsville, Amelia in Amelia County, and Koinonia in the Chester area. As a result of God working through our radio program, the concert in June, and youth and children's retreats/activities, our numbers have grown significantly. On the first Sunday of September there were 122 in attendance with an average of 80 to 85 every Sunday for the rest of the month.

In our effort to spread the Gospel to all the Latino Communities in the Metro Richmond, we are starting seven small groups.

My wife Rebecca and I are taking classes in Arlington at the John Leland Theological Seminary. We are taking two classes on Thursdays, Christian Theology and Life and The Letters of the Apostle Paul. One of our goals is to be able to share with the leaders in the Latino community the opportunity and the benefits of taking seminary classes.

The ESL classes in the Mexico Restaurant will be celebrating their first anniversary soon. Time goes to fast, and the students are growing in their language skills. Thanks to everyone who support this ministry by prayers or teaching the classes.

Please continue praying for my family, especially for the financial resources for my oldest two daughters, and for Rebecca and me to have the Lord's wisdom and strength to continue and increase our impact in the Latino Community in the Metro Richmond area.

### CHRISTMAS DRIVE FOR FLUVANNA CORRECTIONAL CENTER FOR WOMEN

Lynn Litchfield, chaplain at the Fluvanna Correctional Center for Women, has gotten permission to conduct a Christmas Drive for 2007. Toiletry kits, stamps, and cards (especially Christmas cards) are being collected. Stamps are particularly appreciated since it takes an inmate almost two full hours of employment (at 23 cents an hour) to buy a stamp.

Toiletry kits should contain the following items and be packed in a one-gallon zip-loc plastic bag with a hole punched in it:

- ◇ One shampoo, No larger than 16 ounces
- ◇ One lotion, No larger than 16 ounces
- ◇ Two full-size bars of soap
- ◇ One individually wrapped toothbrush
- ◇ One full-size toothpaste
- ◇ One full-size solid deodorant
- ◇ One non-mechanical pencil

Through the "Chaplain's Indigent Kit" program, any "extra" toiletry kits will be used to help women who have the financial support to purchase their own items.
